HISTORY of "The Georgian"- established in 1979, Retired in 1986 and restored today by Thomas Abraham

We have come a long way since 1979, when the first issue of The Georgian started in Malaysia to my classmates from the 77 batch. It grew to include all Georgians and survived until 1986 thanks to donations from OG's around the world. Who collected the donations? We had Philomena Ellis in Australia, Anna Yates in the UK, Dennis Huffton & B. Mohan in India, and Thomas Abraham & Jayachandran in Malaysia. The first couple of issues were typed and then cyclostyled. They were then mailed out by "snail" mail. Then we started photocopying them and sending them to B Mohan in India to be mailed to keep cost down. Mohan then mailed them to the Indian addresses from Chennai. The other countries were mailed out from Malaysia. In 1983, when I came to the US, the project followed me and the cost of postage went up significantly. We reached 100's of people around the world and we had about 50 people who donated to keep the project going.

Today in this new medium - the internet, we will be able to reach a lot more people. The yahoogroups and website under Tusky has made fantastic progress compared to what the Georgian reached in 1979-1986. There are hundreds of OG's that have not heard about the OGA, our annual reunions, the website or yahoogroups. The people that attend the periodic gatherings around the world know what a delightful experience it is. How can we share this feeling? One of the ideas discussed with Tusky back in 2004 before the Yahoogroup was created was to get people to experience the reunion without being there. The Picasa photos does that for the people who read their mail from the Yahoogroups. We have almost 600 registered at Yahoogroups but realistically maybe 100-150?? (a guess) that read the mails and about 40-50 who write in. We have over 700 registered at www.oldgeorgians.com. How do we reach these people? What about the people who are out there who for whatever reasons (college, work, marriage, kids, etc) have not kept in touch and now are thirsting for info from Ketti?

Remember the Georgian - we need a quarterly piece like that can be emailed to all registered at the website, also archived on the website for people to catch up when they missed the online version of the news. It should be sent to all the email addresses of people registered at Yahoogroups. It should be printable to be mailed once a quarter to those without email (and registered at the OGA website). They will need to request a copy in writing.

The news must tug at the hearts of OG's around the world, share photos of school, news of school, meetings around the world, birthdays, anniversaries, good news, kids, marriages, successes, etc. It must make them proud of Ketti. They should miss Ketti after they read a piece/newsletter. This can be posted on Yahoogroups for the people who read the news there.

All we ask of people to do - give us 15 minutes, write once a week and share each one's life with the rest of us. It is not possible for all of us to meet in person - but we can meet on the internet-how? Introduce ourselves and our family by our writings, sharing photos, and connecting with other Georgians.

I challenge our members to reach out and influence at least one person to register at www.oldgeorgians.com. Share the word, share snaps if they are internet savvy. If not, print something and share with them.
